## **IMPORTANT SECURITY INFORMATION**

As a client, you should be aware that there are criminals who run scams on the Internet that attempt to get you to reveal private information. One of the most common types of scams is called "Phishing". In a typical Phishing attack, a criminal will send you an email which appears to be from a well known company, bank or government agency.

The email will direct you to click on a link which directs you to a website or pop-up box that looks like the company's or organization's legitimate site. The site will instruct you to enter personal information, such as your account ID, your password, your credit card number and PIN, or your social security number. The criminals are "phishing" for information.

**Do not, under ANY circumstance, reveal any personal online access information sent via email.**
